Out of school behaviour- reminders and advice [including online behaviour]

Recently, we have been receiving a higher than usual number of calls from parents reporting concerns involving pupils from our school which are happening outside of the school grounds/hours.

I would like to take this opportunity to remind parents/carers that it is parental responsibility to ensure the welfare of their child when they are not at school.

- If any member of the public has any concerns about a child's welfare they are asked to report the matter to Denbighshire County Councils' Children and Family Support Gateway on the following number: 01824712200
- If any member of the public has any concerns about potential harassment/ bullying, including the use of devices they are asked to report the matter to the police on the following number: 101 [North Wales Police]
- If any member of the public has any concerns about a child's behaviour online, please report the matter to the police on the following number: 101 [North Wales Police]

We work very closely with the above agencies and try to support families and children as much as possible. The pupils are taught and reminded about expectations and standards of behaviour at school and beyond but we are aware that we cannot control what happens when pupils are not in school. We regularly remind parents/carers and pupils about age appropriate apps, games and how to stay safe online and also expected standards of behaviour in the community. However, it remains parental responsibility to monitor and supervise their child's online behaviour, including the use of apps and social media.



We adopt Denbighshire County Councils Engagement and Behaviour policy, and this policy is due for review soon. We always welcome feedback. Please contact the school office if you would like to offer any feedback which can be considered when we come to review this policy.

Parking

This week, we have received a phone call from a member of the public who works at the Dolwen Residential Care Home at the bottom of the hill explaining that there have been several people parking in the residents parking spaces. Concerningly, one or two people have been abusive when asked to keep the residents area free. All schools on our site have been asked to remind parents/carers and anyone else who picks up at this area to not park in the residents parking spaces. I have advised the member of public to also contact Denbighshire County Council and also the police if this continues, to report individuals as necessary.
