Keeping safe

As shared previously, we have discussed with the children how to stay safe during hot weather. Wearing appropriate clothing, using the correct sun cream, drinking plenty of water and staying out of the sun for long periods of time has been discussed. Please can we ask that you consolidate these messages with your child/ren as we approach the summer holidays. It is also important to discuss **Water Safety** with your child. The lure of open, cold water rivers/lakes and the like can sometimes lead to children, especially, seeking to cool down in the open water. Even good swimmers can be overcome with Cold Water Shock, leaving them in danger. We will discuss this with the children, but ask again for you to consolidate this message at home.

Sports afternoon

Next Tuesday afternoon some of our Year 5 and 6 children will be taking part in a Sports afternoon which will also involve Esgob Morgan and Twm O'r Nant. Cricket, Football and Tag rugby matches will take place and the children have helped organise this with Mr Griffiths' help. Diolch pawb!
